Transitioning into education and conducting, Marian now resides in Portland, Oregon, where she serves as the conductor of the Sinfonietta Orchestra at the Metropolitan Youth Symphony and as the Program Strings Coordinator at BRAVO Youth Orchestras. Additionally, she manages the BRAVO Community Orchestra. Marian's dedication to music education and social change is evident in her involvement as a panelist for All Classical Portland's "Recording Inclusivity Initiative" and her receipt of the CBDNA Mike Moss Conducting Study Grant in 2022.

Beyond her professional achievements, Marian is committed to creating supportive learning environments for her students, helping them develop skills that benefit both their musical and personal lives. Her work reflects a passion for using music as a catalyst for positive social change, mirroring the ethos of her mentor, Maestro Abreu.

NIKITA ISTRATOV, 17, piano, has been playing the piano since the age of 6. Currently in the 12th grade, he is completing the IB Diploma in Portland, OR. In 2021, he achieved Level X of the OMTA Syllabus program "With Distinction." Nikita's performance highlights include two appearances at Weill Recital Hall in NYC, winning first prize at the 2021 Pittsburgh International Piano Competition, third prize at the 2022 Pacific International Piano Competition, and second prize at the 2022 American Protégé Piano and Strings International Piano Competition. He also won first prize at the 2021 Oregon State OPUS competition, the 2022 Golden Classical Music Awards International Competition, and the 2021 OMTA Donna and David Eason Scholarship. Additionally, he attended the 2023 NYU MPAP Summer Piano Intensive and holds a pilot's license. Nikita enjoys attending concerts and photography.



CYRUS NGAN, 18, piano, is a senior at Clackamas High School, has played the piano for over twelve years, and currently studies with María García. In addition to piano, Cyrus also studies the cello with Erin Ratzlaf. On piano, Cyrus is the winner of the 2024 Eugene Symphony Young Artist Competition, was the co-winner of the 2023 Metropolitan Youth Symphony Concerto Competition, and has participated in masterclasses with renowned pianists such as William Chapman Nyaho & Janina Fialkowska. On cello, he had the privilege of serving as principal cellist of the 2024 OMEA All-State Symphony Orchestra and was featured on Thursdays @ Three with the Pacific Rose Ensemble, a group he cofounded with friends in the Metropolitan Youth Symphony. This year, Cyrus is one of All Classical's Young Artist Ambassadors, serving alongside fellow YAD! winner Haruka Sakiyama. Outside of music, Cyrus enjoys amateur photography and breadmaking. He's also a varsity & club swimmer and often wonders if he has the lung capacity for a woodwind.

EMILY SEO, 15, cello, is a freshman at Jesuit High School. She started cello at 5 years old and currently studies with Professor Hamilton Cheifetz. Emily joined the PYP in 2017, and this is her fourth season in the Philharmonic Orchestra. In 2023 she was a recipient of the Monday Music Club Scholarship and won an honorable mention in the 2023 Oregon MTNA Senior Strings Competition. She was a finalist for the 2023 and 2024 Oregon Mozart Players Young Soloists Competition. Emily won first prize in Oregon for the 2022 OPUS Music Competition and received an honorable mention in the 2022 Oregon MTNA Junior Strings Competition. In summer 2023, she received an Artistic Merit Award and participated in the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music Summer String Academy. She has had the honor to perform for cellists including Richard Aaron, Amir Eldan, Norman Fischer, Peter Prosser, and Dennis Parker. This summer, Emily looks forward to attending the Center Stage Strings Summer Program at the University of Michigan with a Merit Scholarship, as well as the National Symphony Orchestra's Summer Music Institute.



ELLIE LIU, 13, cello, is an 8th grader at Stoller Middle School, has started playing the cello at age 6 under the guidance of Ms. Hyun-Jin Kim. Ellie has won numerous awards and honors for her cello performance, including Honorable Mention at the MTNA Junior Division, Young Star Award at Amadeus Orchestra Solo Competition, and Winner at Willamette Falls Concerto Competition in 2023. She was also a finalist at the ASTA Solo Competition and Oregon Mozart Player Young Artist Competition in 2022 and 2023. Besides, Ellie has participated in various competitions and festivals, such as OMTA Festivals, Great Composer of the Best Bach Performance, The Grand Metropolitan International Music Competition, and American Protégé competition. Ellie loves playing chamber music and is currently the youngest cellist in Portland Youth Philharmonic. She also served as the Assistant Principal of their Young String Ensemble in 2020.



KAYLEE NAH, 14, violin, is a freshman at Sunset High School in Portland, Oregon. She has studied the violin under Hae-Jin Kim since the age of five, and has been in the Portland Youth Philharmonic for six years. She was the state winner of the MTNA Junior String Competition for both the 2022-23 and 2023-24 seasons. She won the MTNA 2023-24 NW Division and placed as one of the seven national finalists. In 2024, Kaylee received the \$2,000 Monday Musical Club Phillips Award for the best instrumental performance, and won first place in the OMEA State Championships for both solo violin and chamber ensemble. Additionally, she served as the concertmaster for the 2024 OMEA All-State Orchestra. She attended the Heifetz International Music Institute in the summer of 2023, and will be attending the Interlochen Arts Camp with a full scholarship this summer. In addition, Kaylee has also been studying the piano for 9 years with Olivia Kim.

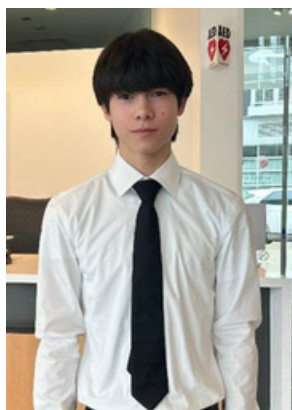
FIRST WINNING ALTERNATE
